JUNE REAL ALES

Sam Brook's Wandle 3.8%, brewed in Wandsworth, this refreshing ale has a spicy herbaceous smell and a light and lemony taste.

Sharp's Doom Bar 4.0%, named after the infamous sandbank at the mouth of Camel Estuary in North Cornwall, this ale combines a taste of succulent dried fruit, lightly roasted malty notes and a subtle yet assertive bitterness.

Cornish Coaster 3.6%, another beauty from Cornish Brewer Sharp's, this lower strength ale has a fresh aroma and blends seamlessly with light fruity – sweet notes, a perfect drink to quench the thirst on a hot summer day.

Wells Waggedance 4%, an amber beer with a touch of honey on the nose and palate. The sweetness is balanced by a healthy dose of hops to provide the bitterness that gives a wonderfully delicate flavour.

Deuchars IPA 3.8%, a champion cask ale, a brilliant blend of malt and hop character

Young's London Gold 4.55 %, a light, golden and full – flavoured beer with a refreshing bite

Tribute 4.2%, a magnificent bronze coloured English bitter with a rich aroma of biscuity malt and tart citrus fruit.
